From the moment we are born, we find ourselves in different situations. We are born to a specific family, in a specific town, during a specific time. As we grow, life brings us through unique circumstances, and day by day our access to different areas and people become more refined. We learn a certain language and perhaps pick up a new language or two along the way. We may finish school and continue to attend college, which might lead us other opportunities. At times, we make a mistake and find ourselves in a setting which creates an entryway into a place or group of people that most people aren't naturally around. Simply put, the further we journey through life, the more particular we become thus making us "insiders."

As we think about what we are called to, where we are right now has a great effect on discerning where or to whom we are called. Someone who finds himself in prison for example most likely won't be called to reach out to secondary school students. It would be more likely that he would be called to prison ministry. Prison then becomes not a hindrance to your calling but an opportunity to reshape it in light of the needs you have access to. You might find yourself teaching second level education equivalency to prisoners instead. Likewise, someone who finds herself house bound most likely won't be called to reach athletes. It would be more likely that she would be called to reach those who she is around in her daily life. Where we naturally find ourselves says a lot about where we are called.

However, this is not to say that just because we aren't in the perfect situation now that we can't be called to minister to those we aren't around. Some people are called overseas, but it isn't the right time for them to go. A classic example of this could be the college student who feels God leading them to serve out of this country, but needs to finish their degree first. This does not mean they are not called to a certain country or people group, but that they may have an interim calling between then and now. If one is called to Asia but is unable to go, then their calling might be to ready themselves at home by learning the language and culture and spending time with Asians in their city.

Consider Paul's statement in relation to this principle:

"Nevertheless, each person should live as a believer in whatever situation the Lord has assigned to them, just as God has called them. This is the rule I lay down in all the churches." 1 Corinthians 7:17
